¹ **Washington** is a member of WREB. Only the dental examination falls under CRDTS.

² **California** legislation to join WREB addresses only the dental examination, not the dental hygiene examination. California also administers its own state board examination.

³ **New York** accepts NERB dental hygiene examination. No longer requires a clinical examination for dental licensure; applicants must complete an accredited postgraduate program at least one year in length (PGY-1).

⁴ **Nevada** is not a member of any clinical testing agency but is a member of ADEX⁵ and administers the ADEX-approved American Dental Licensing Examination (ADLEX). Nevada also accepts WREB results.

⁵ **ADLEX** – American Dental Licensing Examination. The ADLEX was developed by the American Board of Dental Examiners (ADEX). ADEX is a private not for profit consortium of state and regional dental boards throughout the United States and its territories that provides for the ongoing development of a series of common, national dental licensing examinations that are uniformly administered by individual state or regional testing agencies on behalf of their participating and recognizing licensing jurisdictions.
