



2.1 MILLION Total number of hospital emergency department visits for dental conditions in the United States in 2017. × 70%

\$2.7 BILLION Total amount of dollars spent on hospital emergency department visits in the United States in 2017.

40% of hospital emergency department visits for dental conditions among **adults** in the United States that are paid for by Medicaid.



of hospital emergency department visits for dental conditions among **children** in the United States that are paid for by Medicaid.

Medicaid expansion under the Affordable Care Act led to increased dental coverage and dental care use among Medicaidenrolled adults, some of which occurred in hospital emergency departments.²
