

Influenza Vaccines for Dental Health Care Workers During the Pandemic

While researchers continue to learn more about the virus that causes COVID-19, the CDC continues to recommend influenza vaccines for health care workers during the pandemic.

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) [recommends](#) that all health care workers, including dentists and staff, receive the flu vaccine every year. In fact, the agency recommends the annual influenza vaccination for people age six months older who do not have contraindications as a strategy to decrease morbidity and mortality caused by influenza.
